Priority Initiative 1

Housing Security

Objective 1 (Long-Term): Increase access for older adults to affordable, supportive and/or accessible housing.



Priority Initiative 2

Public Information & Resource Campaign

Objective 1 (Short-Term): Create two information campaigns utilizing OC Navigator specific for Older Adults and their Caregivers

Objective 2 (Short-Term): Enhance coordination and collaboration of efforts to provide and/or expand resource fairs specific for Older Adults and their Caregivers within all five supervisorial districts across the County.



Priority Initiative 3

Enhanced Care Coordination

Objective 1 (Long-Term): Implement a data integration program to enhance care coordination for OC older adults and their caregivers through the design of an aging cohort to address their needs across the systems of care.



Priority Initiative Progress Monitoring

Example of Reporting for Priority Initiative Action Items

Tracking Categories	Description
Progress	Tracking of progress will be captured in percentage toward 100% completion of each action item.
Anticipated Completion Date	The anticipated completion date will be identified, acknowledging this may be fluid.
Other Notes	Any other notes regarding completion of action items will be included.

Example of Reporting of Progress Indicators for Priority Initiatives

Tracking Categories	Description
Population Considerations	Action items will include target populations as identified by the priority initiative action teams, if applicable.
Key Performance Indicator	Key performance indicators include any identified outcomes related to the actions to monitor and report the effectiveness of the initiatives. These may be short, medium and long term.
Metrics	Metrics include any outputs related to monitor programmatic aspects of the actions.
Strategic Priority	If applicable, priority initiatives that are linked to the SFP will be identified and tracked.
Other Notes	Any other notes regarding the priority initiative will be included.
